

St Giles London Central Cost of Living Guide for Students 2021

London is one of the most exciting cities in the world. There are over 10,000 restaurants, bars, pubs, markets and theatres! Although London is not cheap, it is possible to enjoy many of the city's delights without spending too much money. This guide will help give you an idea of what you might expect to pay when you are out and about in London and at the school. All prices are approximate and may vary.

Entertainment/Social Programme

St Giles London Central offers a social programme to help you make the most of your time in the UK. Some activities, such as a film night at the school and football in the park, will be free. Others will have a charge, such as bowling, a boat party, cinema or a musical. You can also go on weekend excursions.

A guide to prices is included below. If you take part in one weekend excursion and 3 evening activities a week (including a musical and some free events) you should expect to spend about $\pounds75$ (not including drinks at a pub night).

The London Underground network is commonly called 'the tube' and it is divided into zones. London Central is in Zone 1. Most people in London live in zones 3 and 4 and this is where most of our host families are located.
