

How to travel from the Airport to St Giles Eastbourne

Should you choose not to book our airport transfer taxi service, you can find below our suggested routes to get from the main airports to Eastbourne by train:

Heathrow: You can take the Piccadilly Underground Line to South Kensington, and then change to take the District or Circle Underground Line to Victoria Station. This will take about 60 minutes. From there you can take a mainline train to Eastbourne, which will take about 90 minutes. It will cost approximately £57.

Gatwick: From here you can take a mainline train directly to Eastbourne. It will take about 55 minutes and cost approximately £8.50.

Luton: From Luton Airport take a mainline train to Luton Airport Parkway. From here you can take a train to East Croydon. At East Croydon you can change to a mainline train to Eastbourne. This will take about 2 hours and 40 minutes and cost approximately £46.

Stansted: From Stansted airport you can take a mainline train to London Liverpool Street. This will take about 45 minutes. From there you can take a Central Underground Train to Oxford Street and then change to the Victoria Line and take an Underground Train to London Victoria. This will take about 25 minutes. At Victoria you can take a mainline train to Eastbourne which will take about 90 minutes. This will cost approximately £48.

A third option for travel is by coach. You can visit www.nationalexpress.co.uk to check journey options, prices and times.

When arriving at Eastbourne train or coach station, you can take a local taxi or bus to your accommodation. Once you have booked your course, our office will advise the exact location of your accommodation so you can plan this.

Please note that students under 16 coming to St Giles Eastbourne must book an airport transfer on arrival and departure. We also strongly recommend that students aged 16 and 17 coming to the UK book the service as well, to avoid problems with immigration procedures.
