



To help you to prepare for your stay in Brighton, we have put together a 'cost of living' guide. This should help you to estimate how much money you will need to bring to England with you. We look forward to welcoming you to St Giles Brighton!

Entertainment/Social Programme

St Giles Brighton offers a social programme to help you make the most of your time in the UK. Some activities, such as a film night, yoga classes at school and football, will be free. Others will have a small charge, such as bowling, cinema or cream tea. You can also go on weekend excursions.

A guide is included below. If you take part in one weekend excursion and 3 evening activities a week (where some are free) you should expect to spend about £70 (not including drinks at a pub night).

Brighton Bus tickets are cheaper if purchased online at www.buses.co.uk, you can also download the Brighton bus app from the app store or google play.

If you think you will travel a lot by train, you may like to get a railcard. A Young Persons Railcard available to students aged 16-25 for £30, offering 1/3 discount on Off-Peak rail fares (some students aged over 25 may also be eligible).

Course Books

Course books start from £26. The number of books you need will depend on your own progress. You will usually need a new book each time you change your class; this may be about every 8-12 weeks depending on your personal progress.

You may also want to buy additional self-study materials to help you during your stay and a grammar books costs around £27.

If you would like to take an examination during your stay with us, you will need to pay extra for the examination. You can arrange to take the following examinations at St Giles Brighton:
